We will be attending a performance of The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe at Queens College as our quest starter. We will also make use of the fantastic outdoor learning environment here at school to access a hands-on curriculum.

To conclude the topic we are lucky enough to have a theatre company visit the school to put on a performance of Oliver Twist.

We will study Banksy as a local and current artist and use his creative style to create our own piece of wall graffiti in the classroom.

We will study music from the movies including dramatic classical pieces used for films such as Star Wars. We will learn about tempo and ostinato to create our own backing music for significant film scenes.

Through our language studies we will translate and act out French plays and poems and explore how French films and plays are produced. The children will be exploring their morals and consciences and learning about making good choices as they continue to mature.
