


Quest Title:

Journeys



As historians we will...
Find out about the Viking's invasion of England and the impact on the English way of life.

As geographers we will:
Take a journey through Europe, studying locations on maps, concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries and major cities.

As mathematicians we will:
Learn about number and place value by counting in various multiples and backwards through zero to include negative numbers, order and compare numbers beyond 1000, rounding, solving problems and representing and estimating numbers.
Focus on the four number operations; addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
Measure, compare and convert lengths (m/cm/mm) and perimeter.

As technologists we will:
Construct a Viking long ship.
Use ICT coding programme 'Scratch', to make an animation of the water cycle.

As scientists we will:
Learn about different states of matter, including water.
Learn about the water cycle and the journey of water.

As writers we will:
Use our class text, 'Beowulf', to write our own Beowulf inspired quest tales.
Learn how to write persuasive letters.
